4 FIRST AID MEASURES

Inhalation: If symptoms develop, move victim to fresh air. Give oxygen or artificial respiration if needed. GET IMMEDIATE MEDICAL ATTENTION.

Fire Fighting Methods

Evacuate area of unprotected personnel. Wear protective clothing including NIOSH Approved self-contained breathing apparatus. Remain upwind of fire to avoid hazardous vapors and decomposition products. Use water spray to cool fire exposed containers and disperse vapors.

Unusual Fire or Explosion Hazards:

This material in contact with water or acids may generate sufficient heat to ignite nearby combustible materials. Contact with aluminum, tin, or zinc will result in the generation of heat and release of hydrogen gas. Run-off from fire control may cause pollution. Keep fire-exposed containers cool with water spray to prevent rupture due to excessive heat.
